Before Christmas, The Eco Club entered an Eco-film or poster competition and Rupert House came first out of all the schools in England!



Here is an exciting science experiment to try at home.

How to make An Exploding VOLCANO!

Ingredients: tray or plate, brown playdoh, ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda, 60ml vinegar, a few drops of food colouring, ½ tablespoon washing up liquid.

Step1: Mould your play doh or plasticine into a volcano shape, with a deep hole in the center. Place it on a tray or plate.

Step 2: Mix bicarbonate of soda and washing up liquid together in a bowl and then pour it into the center of the volcano.

Step 3: Mix vinegar and food colouring in a bowl. Then carefully pour it into the center of the volcano.

Step 4: Sit back and watch your volcano erupt!
